This is the 3rd letter to inform you that we fear for ourselves even more now. Lt. Hayes is allowed to interview P.O. Lawrence and P.O. Weston. Lt. Hayes called both officers asking them about this complaint. Do you think this might be INTIMIDATING? How can this possibly be allowed? I fear that these officers will not tell the truth about Lt. Hayes because the intimidation factor. These officers have to work in this environment for this Lt. and Capt. Who is a very good friend of Hayes.

I am afraid to come forward as these commanders have high ties with other high ranking commanders.

If you interview the entire 2012 B Platoon, you would get the larger picture of the way Lt. Hayes was instructing his officers to arrest African-Americans (civil rights violations).

I hope that the ACLU and/or the news media press do not review arrest registers, as it would reveal the disparity. I think we all fear that nothing will be done, because the target of the complaint is able to freely go after the officers. I see now that if we come forward this could not be kept "Confidential" and Lt. Hayes and his "Connections" would crush our careers.
