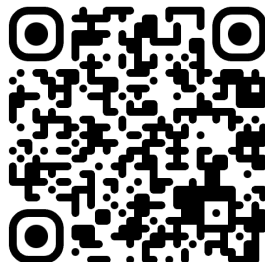
BACKGROUND

When Amendment 3 passed in November of 2022, recreational marijuana use and possession became legal in the state of Missouri. With the legalization of marijuana, thousands of people are eligible to have their records cleared for related offenses. For those who are on probation or parole or who have already been released from jail or prison for eligible marijuana offenses, the Court is in the process of automatically expunging these records. If you are currently incarcerated, you must petition the Court for your marijuana related offenses to be expunged.



HOW TO APPLY FOR EXPUNGEMENT

If you are currently incarcerated or living in a half-way house, the expungement process is not automatic. To petition the Court to have your record expunged, you must fill out and submit the petition form in the circuit court of the county in which you were charged.

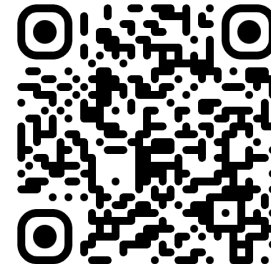

WHAT ABOUT VOTING?

Although voting is ineligible to individuals convicted of a felony, it is not permanent unless you are convicted of an election offense. Once your sentence and probation/parole is complete, you become eligible to register to vote.
